

MediaCity Weekend Stage

The festival's main hub with music and performance across the weekend. Don't miss: The Musical Story of The Gingerbread Man with the BBC Philharmonic - Neo soul from Lovescene - family rave with Playhouse Project - And a funk and soul-tastic Craig Charles festival finale.

MediaCity Piazza

The heart of the festival – expect food, drink, arts and craft markets, the North's first <u>Charity Super.Mkt</u>, roaming performances and more. Or just grab a deckchair, a drink and soak up the main stage action.

And on Sunday afternoon, cheer on the 15 brave young artists at <u>Art Battle: The Next Generation</u> – the live competitive painting event opening the floor to the next generation for the first time.

The Reading Lawn / The Green

From horticultural fun to pop-up libraries and creative workshops! RHS Bridgewater will be on hand for a plant swap and propagation tips; enjoy fruit and veg fun and games with Walk the Plank's Veg Tombola; oin, read and borrow with the Salford Pop-Up Library and National Literacy Trust; then head to CBeebies Bedtime Stories LIVE to enjoy stories read by a host of special guests.

Quayside Shopping Centre

Check out the Science and Industry Museum's huge hands-on activity, Mega Makers; help Manchester Street Poem create a huge artwork; pop in Flock & Gaggle to make your own Salford Bird; head to the pop-up Community Clothing swap shop; join workshops on street dance, printing, acapella and more, then top it all off by bringing your A-game to the Ping Pong Parlour.
